As to the Covenant of the League of Nations, it is a reactionary institution rather than a progressive one, in that it ignores the whole modern trend toward the establishment of international relations upon the foundations of law, rather than upon compromise and expediency. The Covenant of the League of Nations looks to the establishment of superintendence over international relations by political as distinguished from legal methods. There is not a single reference to international law in the whole Covenant that points to any definite plan whatever for the progressive improvement and extension of that law. In neither the Council of the League of Nations nor in any body to function under it, in the proposed settlement of disputes, is there any provision for the limitation of their actions within the settled principles of law. It is possible for the League of Nations to take up and carry on the achievements of the last..
